### **REGULAR PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES**

January 24, 2022 Indian Hills High School, Auditorium, 7:00 P.M.

#### Roll Call

Upon roll call at 7:00 P.M., the Board members responded as follows: Mmes. Emmolo, Underfer, King, Koulikourdis, and Sullivan. Messrs. Carolan, Fortunato, Setteducato, and Lorenz. Dr. Rui Dionisio, Superintendent of Schools; Mr. Thomas Lambe, Business Administrator/Board Secretary; and Mr. Rodney Hara Board Counsel, were also present.

The meeting was called to order by the Board President at 7:59 P.M. Mr. Carolan announced that adequate notice of the meeting has been posted and published as required by law.

A motion was made by Ms. King and seconded by Mr. Setteducato and unanimously carried into the Closed Executive Session for the purpose of discussing Personnel and HIB investigations. Information from the Closed Executive Session will be made public at the discretion of the Board, as per Board Bylaw 0166, Executive Sessions, or as otherwise authorized by law. The closed Executive Session was adjourned at 7:45 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by the Board President at 7:59 P.M. Mr. Lambe announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to ensure the rights of the public to have advance notice of and to attend meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interest is discussed or acted upon. He also announced that in accordance with the provisions of this act, the business administrator/ board secretary has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-8(b), and guidance from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services. He read a public statement advising the public to be aware that employees of the Ramapo Indian Hills Regional High School District retain the right of privacy and shall retain all rights regarding defamation and slander according to the laws of New Jersey. Mr. Lambe further stated that the Board shall not be held liable for comments made by members of the public and, in order to protect the privacy rights of employees in the District, the Board shall not respond to statements made by the public of or about District employees. Mr. Lambe also made a statement encouraging all attendees to practice preventive measures by wearing a face covering as per the Governor's executive order. He also noted that if individuals had a medical exemption, that they take advantage of the space in the auditorium.

Mr. Carolan asked the audience to put their masks on. Mr. Carolan noted the state mandate and paused the meeting to see if the audience not wearing masks would comply with the request to wear their masks.
